On December 31, 2017, there were 90 ministers of Word and Sacrament on the rolls of the Presbytery, 18 of whom were living outside of the bounds of the Presbytery. There were 70 churches entitled to be represented by 83 ruling elder commissioners. There were also 11 ruling elders commissioned to particular service and 8 ruling elders by virtue of office. On December 31, 2018, 88 ministers of Word and Sacrament were on the rolls of the Presbytery, 17 of whom were living outside the bounds of the Presbytery. There were 68 churches

Based upon the “goal of numerical parity of teaching elders and ruling elders,” the “principles of participation” and the need to communicate the plan for the determining commissioners, the Presbytery has adopted a plan [Book of Order; G-3.0301; Manual; 1.1003] designating the number of commissioners based upon church membership (table below) and designating other ruling elders by virtue of office to be given the privilege of voice and vote at all Presbytery meetings [Manual; 1.1009]. Although with this plan, there is an imbalance regarding the number of eligible ruling elder commissioners (actually more than ministers), the actual participation patterns still reflect a greater number of ministers participating. In 2018, minister of Word and Sacraments members outnumbered ruling elder members in attendance slightly by an average of 2 per meeting. Consequently, in order to continue to aspire to the goal of balance, the current larger number of possible ruling elder commissioners based upon the current plan should be retained until actual participation rates change. Therefore, I do not recommend any equalization adjustment at this time.

- It was MSP to adjourn the meeting of the corporation with prayer and return to the ecclesiastical meeting of the Presbytery. Sue Washburn closed the meeting of the corporation for Presbytery of Redstone with prayer.
- Upon recommendation of the Council, it was MSP to dismiss, with thanksgiving, the Windber and West Leisenring administrative commissions since their work in disposition of all necessary matters has concluded.

- Budget and Stewardship reported that the 2019 pledges were reviewed and found that with an increased pledge by some churches there had been a similar number decreasing their pledge. There were still pledges to be received, but this might mean consideration for possible budget revision if the pattern holds.

CONNECTING TOGETHER

The Presbytery teamed up with those seated near and reflected upon the past year about ways that God's hand was seen within ministries or congregations. The teams also looked forward to this New Year and the hopes and imagining what might see God's blessing in this year, the teams were also encouraged to pray with one another.

COMMITTEE ON MINISTRY REPORT

Rev. Pete Goetschius presented the following report and action items for the Committee on Ministry:

- The Committee on Ministry recommended, and it was MSP to approve renewal of all "temporary" pastor agreements pending submission of the agreement and adequate compensation terms.
- The Committee on Ministry celebrates those pastors with ordination anniversaries (5/10-year intervals) in 2019.
- The Committee on Ministry presents information about the upcoming Enrichment Day (2/9) and commends it to you for your participation in leadership development. (See Appendix E)
- The Committee on Ministry recommended, and it was MSP to approve the commissioning service for the Rev. Jane Johnson and the Ft. Burd and Calvin churches in Brownsville. The commissioning service will be conducted by an Administrative Commission appointed by the Moderator. Rev. Pete Goetschius, chair of Committee of Ministry prayed with Rev. Jane Johnson on the next step of her journey. The time and date of the commissioning service will be forthcoming to the members of the Presbytery.
- Moderator Laura Blank highlighted the upcoming Retreat for Pastors on April 28-29.

MISSION COMMITTEE REPORT

Rev. Sylvia Carlson, Chairperson of the Mission Committee spoke about the Sudan and South Sudan Presbyterian Evangelical Church partnership. We are celebrating 15 years of partnership with Sudan/South Sudan Presbyterian Evangelical Church. Information about Greensburg Meals on Wheels Program brochures were distributed. Duffy Greba from Greensburg, Westminster Church cooks on Tuesdays at the Greensburg Meals on Wheels. The cost of meals is \$3.50. There is hope that a trip will be forthcoming to Sudan/South Sudan in the near future. A video from Rev. Philip Obang, General Secretary of the South Sudan Presbyterian Evangelical Church was shown to the assembly.

ADDICTIONS MINISTRY NETWORK REPORT

Rev. Lee McDermott introduced the presbyters to the upcoming curriculum project for churches educating about addictions ministry. The curriculum will help congregations to better understand the impact of addiction. The Addictions Ministry received a grant that part of which involves distributing Life Recovery Bibles, more information will be provided at the March meeting of Redstone Presbytery. The curriculum will be forthcoming.

Rev. Laura Blank offered a report. Thanks were given for those who contributed to the Advent Devotional booklet and to those who sent in photos.
