### **STATED CLERK’S REPORT**

#### **Report of the Stated Clerk:**

### **REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE PRESBYTER**

Rev. Richard "Skip" Noftzger, Executive Presbyter, noted his written report. How many of us have seen that State Farm Commercial that begins with "I'm never getting married, etc." He had his own list: I'll never be one of those suits – and one of the final ones – I'll NEVER be an Executive Presbyter. And now he begins his 3<sup>rd</sup> year as Executive here in Redstone. We, though our mission remains constant, are presented with new opportunities. The things that we have taken for granted were trappings – and so we wonder what kind of leadership it will take to follow God in these times. Leadership is about saying yes to new things and not saying "no." Tonight we celebrate leadership in a variety of ways. We also celebrate some of the faithful clergy who are celebrating ordination anniversaries.

### **TREASURER'S REPORT**

Ruling Elder John A. Dickson, IV, Treasurer, presented the Financial Reports calling attention to the reports for the end of April. The work that has been done to balance the budget and stay within our means continues. He noted the following: at the end of April, our assets have increased by \$9,444 to date.

### **PINE SPRINGS CAMP, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR**

Mr. Greg Davis, the Executive Director of Pine Springs Camp said that there are about 3 more weeks until their 68<sup>th</sup> camp seasons starts. In 1929, a log chapel was built on the property, owned by the former Blairsville Presbytery, that led to the establishment of a camping ministry in 1948. Mike Hurley spoke about the program whereby counselors can be "adopted" by a congregation. It is so helpful to the camp leadership to know that congregations are praying for them and supporting them in various ways.

### **BOARD OF PENSIONS, Rev. Doug Portz**

He is thankful to have had the opportunity to speak to the presbyters. Doug is based in Pittsburgh, so he is nearby. He is a pastor, having served congregations in a variety of settings. His wife is on the staff at Shadyside and his daughter is pastor at Elfinwild. He began his work for the BOP last summer. The pension fund is sound. Every month the board pays out \$30 million to retirees. A 2% experience apportionment will go into effect July 1. The board of directors voted a plan redesign. Installed pastors' plans will remain the same. For people who are serving part time or are serving in interim or temporary pastorates, there will be a menu of options after July 11. He wants the churches to support the "assistance" program. Housing supplements and income supplements are available to retirees who are in need of them. Vacancy dues go toward this. There are adoption assistance grants available, and transition to college grants. There are \$3000 sabbatical grants available.

### **MISSION COMMITTEE OF COUNCIL**

Rev. Sylvia Carlson, Chairperson of the Mission Committee, mentioned that we hope to have several people from the South Sudan Presbyterian Evangelical Church here either in June or July. We hope that they will be able to spend a week visiting congregations here in Redstone Presbytery. She asked commissioners to watch for an announcement regarding their time in Redstone.

Sylvia introduced Rob Liermann, of the Community Methodist Church of Harrison City, to talk about their Ramp building ministry, Road to Freedom, a joint ministry of First Presbyterian Church of Irwin and the Community United Methodist Church in Harrison City. The presentation included a power point presentation showing the ramps that have been built in Jeannette, Lower Burrell, Johnstown, and Sarver. They have completed 37 ramps in just under 3 years. They use 8-10 people for any one project.

They build 6' long modular sections. Pine Run members participated in the building and installation of the ramp in Lower Burrell. If people qualify under the income guidelines, the ramps are free. They welcome others to participate in their work.

The following General Assembly Commissioners were commissioned during worship: Ruling Elders Bernice Adams and Tom Shipley; Teaching Elders Colleen Molinaro and Curtis Paul (unable to be present); and YAAD Mandi Pascarella.

### **ACTION AGENDA**

#### **Council**

Elder Glenn Hart, chair of Council presented the following report and action items from the Council:

#### **Action Items**

- The Council presented the following person to serve as a replacement for an unexpired term on the Nominating Committee.  
Nominating Committee—Rev. Marnie Abraham Russell  
With there being no nominations from the floor, it was **MSP** to approve the nomination.
- Along with the report of the Pine Run Discernment Team, Pete Goetschius, chair presented the request of the Pine Run Presbyterian Church to be dismissed with property, real and personal, to the Presbytery of the Alleghenies, Evangelical Presbyterian Church based upon completion of the terms included in the report. It was **MSP** to approve the request. The Vice Moderator invited the representatives from Pine Run Church to come forward for a time of prayer.

#### **Information Items**

- The moderator recommended the Rev. Marnie Abraham Russell to the Council to fill an open slot on the Nominating Committee. **MSP** to approve and recommend her nomination to the presbytery at the May meeting.
- Final request from the Pine Run Presbyterian Church following the congregational vote to place the request for dismissal on the agenda of the May meeting of the Presbytery of Redstone. Both Rev. Noftzger and Rev. Goetschius reported on the congregational meeting and the corresponding vote (77 in favor of the request, 1 against, 2 abstentions). The final report is

being finished by the Team and will be forwarded to the Pine Run session and the item has been placed on the agenda for the presbytery meeting under the Council report.

- Receipt of a letter from the Vandergrift Presbyterian Church concerning the appointment of a Team and a desire to enter into the discernment process. This letter had been forwarded on to the Presbytery moderator and COM moderator for appointment of members.
- Upon receiving a request for use of office space within the Presbytery building from Sue Washburn (email), it was **MSP** to approve such usage as a month to month agreement.
- The proposed agenda for the May 17 Presbytery meeting was distributed for consideration and deliberation. Additional items, including the Nominating Committee replacement, were added to revise the agenda. **MSP** to approve the revised agenda for the May 17 Presbytery meeting.
- Approval of the transfer of membership of Judy Hauser to the Latrobe Presbyterian Church.
- Approval of the administration of the Lord's Supper with Rev. Marnie Silbert officiating at the 2016 Confirmation Retreat.
- General Assembly overture and concurrence protocols were distributed. Discussion occurred on two main areas of whether overtures/concurrences should ever be permitted either in a called meeting or under new business. The process was revised with deletion of one paragraph and a couple other editorial changes. **MSP** to approve the revised document.

### **Committee on Ministry**

Rev. Dr. Martin Ankrum presented the following report and action items for the Committee on Ministry:

#### **Action Items**

- It was **MSP** by a vote of 34-30 to approve the authorization of COM as a Commission for the purpose of approving calls issued by congregations for the service of teaching elders and approving the examination and transfer of teaching elder from other presbyteries during the time when the presbytery is not in session between the stated meetings of May and September.
- Upon successful examination, it was **MSP** to receive Susan Blank (candidate-Redstone) for ordination to the validated ministry of Director of Pastoral Care (Chaplain) at Presbyterian Senior Care, Oakmont, PA.

#### **Information Items**

1. Update on the session minutes review process with approximately twenty churches remaining to complete. Individual members of the COM volunteered for follow up with the clerks of session of those congregations.
2. Reminder about the need for Child Protection policies in each council (sessions, presbytery, etc.).

2. **MSP** to approve position of Interim Editor, Presbyterians Today as validated ministry for Rev. Sue Washburn (Covenant Pastor, Reunion Presbyterian Church, Mt. Pleasant)
3. **MSP** to recommend to Presbytery that the COM be authorized as a Commission for the purpose of approving calls issued by congregations for the service of teaching elders and approving the examination and transfer of teaching elders from other presbyteries during the time when the Presbytery is not in session between the stated meetings in May and September. The COM acting as a Commission shall make a full report of its actions to Presbytery at its next stated meeting.

Care of Congregations – Jim Farrer reported the following:

1. The Committee continues to encourage prayer for the congregations and sending cards.
2. The Good Neighbor Program continues to be worked on.
3. The Committee is looking for needs and stories where they can be used as a resource such as PW and Mission trips.

2. Skip and Bobbi Jo will be our representatives going to the BOP Regional Benefits meeting in Philadelphia.

Sue Blank has received a call to the permanent position of Director of Pastoral Care (Chaplain) at Presbyterian Senior Care community in Oakmont. She is scheduled to meet with our COM examinations committee and then to be examined at the May 17 Redstone Presbytery meeting for ordination to a validated ministry with permission to labor there (outside the bounds). Pittsburgh Presbytery has been contacted and agrees to the plan.

Taylor Barner is preparing to graduate from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary and is working on his PIF for circulation.

Rick Watson continues enrollment through Dubuque Seminary doing very well. Rick will be recommended for candidacy at the May meeting.

David Deutsch will be completing his first year of enrollment at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary.

- It was **MSP** to approve Taylor Barner to be permitted to “negotiate for service” upon satisfactory revision of his PIF/Statement of Faith. Ken and Caroline were appointed to work with Taylor in providing feedback on these revisions.
- It was **MSP** to approve Taylor Barner as “certified ready to receive a call” upon completion of the revision of the PIF, the M.Div. degree and any remaining requirements.

The Associate Stated Clerk, Rev. Cliff Foster gave the attendance report. He reported that there were 44 Teaching Elders and 5 Commissioned Ruling Elders, 33 Ruling Elders, 1 Christian Educator, 1 by virtue of office, and 18 visitors for a total of 102. There were 48 of churches represented. There also were 26 Teaching Elders excused, 8 Teaching Elders absent, 6 Commissioned Ruling Elders absent and 23 congregations without representation.
