The network began in 2016 with volunteers from Redstone and other communities, county agencies and people who are in recovery. As part of its mission, the

network has handed out Recovery Bibles, worked with ministry partner Hope in a Bag to gather items like toothpaste and soap for people who go to recovery homes, done Narcan trainings and created a curriculum that churches can use as they seek to serve people or families with substance use disorders.
